10th October 2021 - The 19th Sunday after Trinity

Today's gospel is all about choices. The rich young man chose to follow the laws for most of his life. He was given a different choice when Jesus suggested that he sold all his possessions in order to inherit eternal life. For the man, this was too difficult & he walked away dejected.

It is the same for us. When we prioritise listening and following where God is calling us, there will be choices to be made. We may have to sacrifice some things but will gain others. Trusting in him completely might feel like a risk but God loves us and knows us better than we know ourselves. What if trusting all to God doesn't diminish or restrict our life but enhances it?

With the lifting of legally enforced covid restrictions, here at St George's we are mindful that we want to create as safe a place as possible for everyone to worship: we continue to be conscious of the importance of "hands, face, space".

- If you have COVID symptoms or should be self-isolating, do not attend worship
- Wash and/or sanitise your hands often and when entering and leaving the church building
- Wear a face covering inside church, unless you are exempt
- Maintain good social distance
- Do not cause a log jam at the door
- Be aware that others may be more cautious than you are.

We will continue to bring the Sacrament to you in the pews. If you wish to receive, please stand (if able) & hold out your hands; if you wish to receive a blessing instead, please stand & hold onto the service book; if you do not wish to receive either the Sacrament or a blessing, please remain seated with head bowed.
